Concept Note

In the wake of Covid-19, the Department of History, Sophia College, Ajmer, has scheduled a webinar, "Lessons from the Past: Studying Trends and Responses to Epidemics" on 10th and 11th July, 2020 on Google Meet from 2 to 5 pm in the evening. The objective of this webinar is to develop a larger historical understanding of epidemics and famines in a broad temporal and spatial framework. We will try to understand the myriad of ways through which people in general adapt, adopt, understand, interpret, analyze and resolve the problem of epidemics in their day to day life and in the process influences and get influenced by socio cultural and economic boundaries as well as ecological issues that empowers or limits our potential to cope with the epidemics. The webinar will provide a platform to the experts to articulate the impact of epidemics, natural calamities and diseases in the daily lives of people. How the states responded to these epidemics and what was the response of masses to these state policies? Subsequently, the webinar will attempt to capture the ways in which people challenged the authorities in the wake of these epidemics and calamities that affected the basic sustainability of the masses. We will try to have a look at the role religious institutions, colonial government and post colonial interventions played in shaping the way epidemics were perceived and regulated by the state and the society. Finally, through the intense sessions this webinar will comment on the contemporary conditions, response of the state as well as the masses to these challenges. Linking the events of the past with the present, the webinar will conclude with remarks and suggestions to handle the pandemic in present scenario, taking lessons from the past.


